

Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statement

The Editorial Board of «Priroda» expects all parties involved in the act of publishing commit to these publication ethics and will reject any manuscript that does not meet these standards.

The Editorial Board

- is responsible for all articles that are published in «Priroda»;
- must make fair and unbiased publication decisions for submitted manuscripts independent of commercial considerations, must evaluate manuscripts only for their intellectual content and must ensure a fair and appropriate peer review process;
- must keep information pertaining to submitted manuscripts confidential;
- must adopt editorial policies that encourage maximum transparency and complete, honest reporting;
- must guard the integrity of the published record by issuing corrections and retractions when needed and pursuing suspected or alleged research and publication misconduct;
- must pursue reviewer and editorial misconduct;
- must make it clear to peer reviewers and authors what is expected of them;
- must disclose any conflicts of interest.

Reviewers

- must keep information pertaining to submitted manuscripts confidential;
- must evaluate manuscripts only for their intellectual content;
- must disclose any conflicts of interest.

Authors

- must submit papers only on work that has been conducted in an ethical and responsible manner and that complies with all relevant legislation;
- must present their results clearly, honestly, and without fabrication, falsification or inappropriate data manipulation;
- must adhere to publication requirements that submitted work is original, is not plagiarized, and has not been previously published or is not currently being considered for publication elsewhere;
- must take responsibility for submitted and published work;
- must disclose any existing or potential conflicts of interest.
